## Feeding Directions:

### Horses:

Designed to be fed to young horses from 3 months of age until 18 months of age and to those horses being fed low protein forages.

Foals being creep fed: ½ to ¾ lb/100lbs of body weight

Weanlings to 6 months of age: 1 - 1¾ lbs/100lbs of body weight

Yearlings up to 15 months of age: ½ - 1½ lbs /100 lbs of body weight

### Goats:

Kids 3-6 months of age feed free choice

Dry, Pregnant Doe ¼ - ½ lb per day

Lactating Doe 4-6 lbs milk/day feed 1 ½ - 3lbs/day

7-10 lbs milk/day feed 2 ¼ - 4 ½ lbs/day

11-14 lbs milk/day feed 5 - 7 ¼ lbs/day

When fed with legume or mixed mostly legume hay.

### Dairy:

For dairy animals fed high quality hay, haylage and/or pasture and low levels of corn silage. It may be used as a fitting ration and for replacement animals, changing over gradually from Everyday Coarse Sweet 1800 around 3 months of age.

**Feeding Rate:** Varies from ¼ lb/100 lbs body weight at maintenance to 2 ½ lbs/100 lbs body weight for lactation, fattening, or fast growth.

Amount of concentrate depends on quality of forage and condition of animal. Always provide plenty of clean fresh water.

The suggested feeding program is for use as a guide only. The animal's requirements may change due to breed, environment, and management.
